

## A MESSAGE FROM OUR MINISTER

#### December 2023

Dear friends in Christ,

Several years ago, I shared with you about how I had been searching through the YouTube website for the well-known Advent carol O come, O come, Emanuel. There are so many versions of it, from traditional choir renditions to worship groups in churches with a more contemporary feel. I also investigated the origins of this beautiful antiphon that was traditionally sung in monasteries by monks during vespers (the evening prayer) on the days leading up to Christmas from 17 to 23 December. The original O Emanuel version of the carol is more than 1,200 years old but the version we sing is an 1861 adaptation by John Mason Neale, who translated it from the original Latin.

The carol is almost a plea, a calling of the people of God for the coming of the Messiah, Christ Jesus. Jesus is referred to in various ways, using images from the Old Testament including Emanuel (Isaiah 7:14); the 'root' of Jesse (Isaiah 11:1); Key of David (Isaiah 22:22) and literally in verse three 'East' in Latin, for the 'Dayspring' which refers to the sunrise over the eastern horizon (Malachi 4:2).

Now those of you who like word puzzles and solving mysteries might well know what an 'acrostic' is. It is a phrase or poem where a letter in each line spells out another word vertically. For example:

> For God so Loved the world That he gave his only begotten Son That whoever believes in him will not die But have eternal life (John 3:16)

Did you know that the Advent carol *O come, O come Emanuel* has a hidden message? In fact, it contains a reverse acrostic!

The first letter of the titles for Jesus would have been heavily decorated in the manuscripts the monks sung from in church, and it would have been clear to them that, if you take the first letter of the titles for Jesus from the verses of the carol in reverse you could see them shining out from the text (in the original Latin):

| Emanuel   | = | 'God with us' (verse 7)                   |
|-----------|---|---|
| Rex       | = | King                                      |
| Oriens    | = | East ('Day spring' - sunrise in the east) |
| Clavis    | = | Key (of David)                            |
| Radix     | = | Root (of Jesse)                           |
| Adonai    | = | Lord (of might)                           |
| Sapientia | = | Wisdom (from on high) (verse 2)           |

Read together they spell out 'Ero Cras' which means literally, "I will be tomorrow". Isn't that amazing! It is as though, after the fervent calling for the coming of God with us "O come, o come ...", Jesus responds "I will be tomorrow"!

Advent is a time of patiently waiting for the coming of Emanuel, God with us, as foretold by prophets so long ago as the coming of the King, Lord, Root of Jesse, Dayspring of new dawn. How badly we need light in the darkness, especially with so much conflict and injustice making the lives of so many so unpredictable, so painful, so lonely.

How much more important it is this year, then, that we look for the coming of Jesus once again to bring peace, comfort and joy! Let us pray this Advent for a renewed sense of God's presence with us, in the whole world, as we anticipate the birth of Jesus, Emanuel, God with us once again this Christmas. You may like to explore different versions of O



*come, O come, Emanuel* on YouTube, or on CDs as we call for Jesus to be born with us again. <u>Here</u> is a link to particular favourite of mine by Jim Moray.

Marie and I pray that you have a joyful Christmas and a fulfilled new year where our individual, family and church lives will be renewed and strengthened, in Jesus' name.



## JANE SCARTH HOUSE



The Outreach Group have chosen Jane Scarth House to be our charity theme for the first quarter of 2024 Jane Scarth House is a local charity that provides emotional and practical support to anyone whose life is affected by

cancer. This can be the person living with cancer, or a family member, close friend, carer or partner.

Jane Scarth House opened in 1995 and was founded in memory of Romsey resident and mother of two, Jane Scarth, whose family to this day remain closely involved with the work of the charity.

Jane Scarth House has assisted thousands of people and their families affected by cancer and has no geographical boundaries.

Their services, provided in a non-medical setting, range from Befriending and Counselling, to Meditation and other Complementary Therapies such as aromatherapy massage, reflexology, scar massage, Indian head massage, reiki and simple lymphatic drainage massage. They also have a wide range of information available, which covers many aspects of cancer and its emotional effects.

The centre is located at 37a The Hundred, Romsey. Opening hours are Monday to Friday from 9am–4pm and no appointment is needed. #### **CHURCH MEETING NOVEMBER 2023**

The church meeting was well attended. Revd Mike updated on the proposed Church cluster, confirming the number of churches will be 6. In the first few months of 2024, Revd Sarah and Revd Mike will work together to plan how the new cluster will work and changes will start to slowly roll-out across the cluster mid-2024. The Finance teams in each church will work together to plan how finances will be organised.

Andy B gave an update on Fabric works, particularly in relation to the work to the sanctuary, explaining the exterior roofing works to the church had been completed and were now water-tight. The interior works will start on 20 November and it is hoped the work will be complete and the scaffolding dismantled by the end of November. Work to the organ pipes will be undertaken in January and the new curtains will be hung once this work is undertaken. Works to be undertaken in 2024 will encompass items in 1 Abbey Water, Abbey Hall Lounge roof and work to the church tower.

Fundraising ideas: the congregation was asked to bring suggestions to the next church meeting. The present plans for 2024 are flower festival and organ recital, other ideas are being discussed.

Thank you to everyone who stayed after church to attend. The engagement of our congregation, and voting of our members, is central to the decision making of our church.


